

## White Spot Disease (Chapter 4.1.2)

### Article 4.1.2.1

- a) The text incorrectly refers to the plural of shrimp as shrimps. The plural of shrimp is “**shrimp**”.
- b) Within the text, White spot disease is not capitalized as a proper noun. Capitalizations are bolded as indicated. For the purpose of this *Code*, [susceptible host species for **White** spot disease virus are:] all decapod (Order Decapoda) crustaceans from marine, brackish water, or freshwater sources are potential hosts for **White** spot disease. White spot disease is potentially lethal to most commercially cultivated penaeid (Family Penaeidae) shrimps and prawns. Potential transfers of other decapod crustaceans from marine, brackish water or freshwater sources to white spot disease free zones should be subject to risk analysis when there is evidence from experimental challenge studies that one or more species in the *importing country* is susceptible to **White** spot disease.
